Ballard Bay Club by Jewel Hospitality

Location: 6413 Seaview Avenue NW, Seattle WA

Style: Contemporary and inviting with rustic touches


Fab Feature: The view, of course! From this waterside venue you can see Puget Sound and the Olympic Mountains.

Bell Harbor International Conference Center

Location: 2211 Alaskan Way, Pier 66, Seattle WA

Style: Modern, airy

Fab Feature: 180-degree panoramic views of the Olympic Mountains, Mt. Rainier, Elliott Bay and the Seattle

skyline.

Event Space Highlights: The Rooftop Plaza, Outdoor Terrace and wraparound decks overlooking the water let you celebrate all fresco. Indoors, the Harbor Room impresses with its 15-foot ceiling and sweeping Puget Sound vistas.

Notable Services: Their AV partner will make sure you have all the equipment you need, including speakers, mics, LED uplighting, video and slideshow support, and more.

Catering: Provided in-house. Menu options incorporate the seasonal bounty of the Pacific Northwest.

The Canal

Location: 5300 34th Avenue NW, Seattle WA

Style: Elegant, contemporary décor with Art Deco flourishes

Fab Feature: You get to watch life on the canal, which is mesmerizing.

Event Space Highlights: The large heated and covered patio is ideal for a waterfront ceremony or cocktail hour. There's also an indoor bar and lounge, not to mention a two-tiered dining area with a wall of windows.

Notable Services: They're event specialists, and can handle all the details of your wedding.

Catering: Provided in-house. Check out their specialty stations, which include pasta, tapas, Caribbean, Hawaiian, Mexican and sushi & dim sum options.







The Edgewater Hotel

Location: 2411 Alaskan Way, Pier 67, Seattle WA

Style: Pacific Northwest lodge

Interesting Tidbit: Built for the 1964 World's Fair on a dock over Elliott Bay, the Edgewater was the only hotel willing to accommodate the Beatles as guests. Cyclone fencing had to be installed around the perimeter to keep crazed fans at bay!

Event Space Highlights: The view is fabulous from the Olympic Ballroom, where a wall of floor-to-ceiling windows frames a panorama of Elliott Bay, the Olympic Mountains and the Puget Sound Islands. The adjoining Terrace Room comes with a deck that lets you appreciate the sweeping vista of the Seattle skyline from the outdoors. Several other rooms offer options for receptions and rehearsal dinners.

Wedding Package Perks: Overnight accommodations for the newlyweds and a custom menu prepared by their Executive Chef, John Roberts.

Catering: Provided in-house. In addition to a variety of reception displays (including several featuring seafood) and stations (Spanish Paella, Risotto and Northwest Ceviche to name a few), they offer a list of delectable desserts like Key Lime Pie, Hazelnut Chocolate Decadence, and Almond Moscato Panna Cotta with Candied Orange.

The MV Skansonia

Location: 205 NE Northlake Way "A" Dock, Seattle WA

Style: Vintage Washington State Ferry (permanently docked)

Fab Feature: Unsurpassed views of the Seattle Skyline and the Space Needle during your wedding.

Event Space Highlights: The huge forward deck makes a sublime ceremony site, with an almost 360-degree panorama of water and sky. Indoors, dine and dance on a gleaming wood-plank floor—portholes provide windows to the outside, and there's even a fireplace.

Notable Amenity: Tasty late-night treats—like milk and cookie shooters, chicken and waffle canapés, and pot stickers—are available to keep the party going.

Location: 2091 Western Avenue, Seattle WA


Style: Modern, artistic

Location: 1483 Alaskan Way, Pier 59, Seattle WA


Style: Contemporary, creative

Fab Feature: Having local fish as the living-and moving-backdrop to your reception.


Event Space Highlights: Pier 59 at the edge of Elliot Bay is the perfect setting for a ceremony, with the blue waters on one side and the Seattle skyline on the other. The 20' x 40' "Window on Washington Waters" in the Puget Sound Great Hall gives your guests a luminous view of the aquatic life around them, with hundreds of swimming fish acting as built-in décor!
